Example: The soccer match was broadcast live. Advent: (n) the time when something first begins to be widely used Synonym: arrival, coming Satellite: (n) a machine that has been sent to space for radio, television and other electronic communication Range: (n) a number of people or things that are all different but are all of the same general type Example: the company offers a wide range of services. **Display**: (v) to show Example: Shop windows display the latest fashions. Astronomically: (adv) in an extremely high manner Example: The prices have risen astronomically in the past 2 years. (Astronomical: (adj) astronomical prices, costs and fees are extremely high) rise: (v) to increase in number, amount or value (rise-rose-risen) Synonym: go up, climb find out: (phrasal verb) to learn or discover something Appeal: (n) a quality that makes people like something or someone Example: The film has great appeal for young people.
